Current Reminders

- Call your agent to certify acres if you are now done planting corn and beans.
- If you need to replant, you must get prior permission to do so. Please call your agent before replanting
- Corn prevented planting claims if needed can be filed on 6/6/20

Approaching Deadlines

Last day to plant corn and get full coverage (20 day late planting period) 6/5/20

First day to file a prevented planting corn claim 6/6/20

Last day to plant soybeans and get full coverage (25 day late planting period) 6/20/20

Last day to file prevented planting corn claims 6/28/20

Acreage reporting deadline for Spring crops 7/15/20

Please call your agent to review your eligibility and other field details if you want to pursue a prevented planting claim

Court Removes Three Out of Four Dicamba Registrations

The United States court of Appeals of the Ninth District from California announced on June 3rd the EPA registrations for 3 dicamba herbicide products were cancelled immediately. These products had previously been approved for a 2 year period in October 2018. This news is very fluid at this point and the is ample speculation and interpretation of what the ruling means for farmers in the corn belt over the next 60 days.
